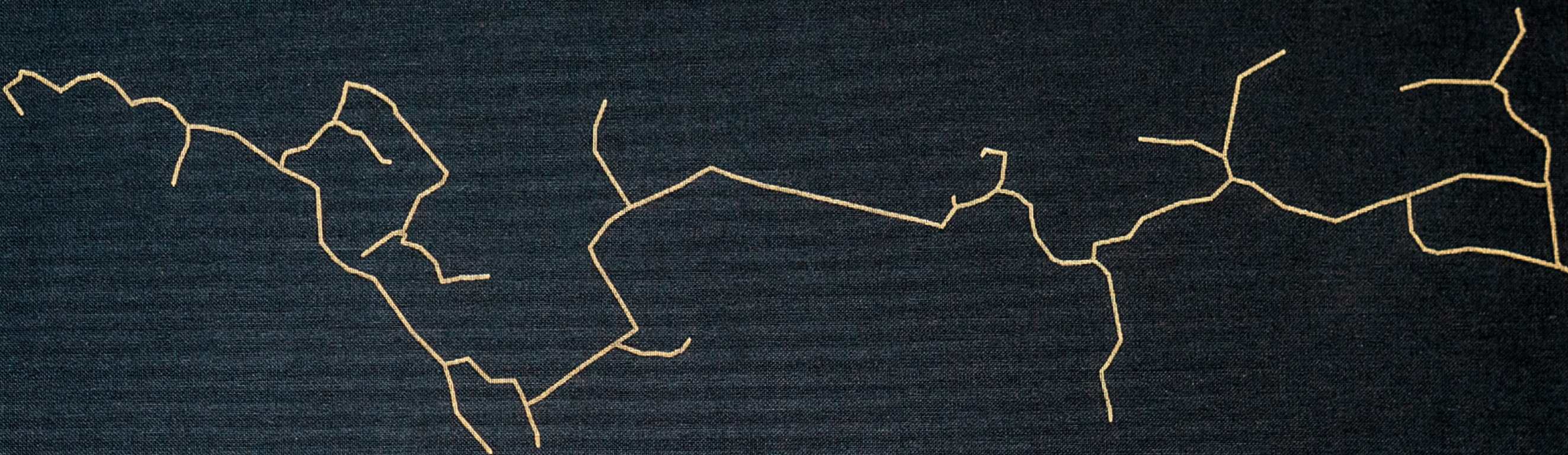


CENOTES OF MAYAKOBA
